Sherwin Area Recreation Plan - Approved!

- The Inyo National Forest officially approved the <u>Sherwin Area Recreation Plan</u> (SHARP) 3 that sets the stage for a thoughtfully designed network of sustainable trails in Sherwin Meadows, replacing an unplanned web of user-created paths that have caused erosion and impacted sensitive habitats over time.
- SHARP 3 includes the restoration of degraded trail segments, decommissioning of unsustainable routes, and the construction of new trails that better serve hikers, bikers, and equestrians all while protecting natural and cultural resources. Trail implementation is scheduled to begin in summer 2025 and will continue through fall 2026.

Reds Meadow Road NOW OPEN!

- Access to Reds Meadow Road is now open. From July 6 August 28, the road will be open from 6:00am Thursdays through Sundays at 11:00pm. (Thursdays will have 1 hour traffic delays from 6:00am-8:00pm.)
- The Reds Meadow Road is currently being reconstructed (<u>learn more</u>...) in order to greatly improve public access and traffic safety for all who visit the area, reduce likelihood of vehicular accidents and improve emergency response times. Following the holiday weekend, traffic delays should be expected on Thursdays.
- The mandatory Eastern Sierra Transit <u>Reds Meadow Shuttle Bus</u> runs daily from 7:00am to 7:00pm, when the road is open. Any other times when the shuttle bus is not running but the road is open, personal vehicles may enter and exit, provided they meet the restrictions listed on the <u>webpage</u>.
